Now these are to certify whom it may concern, that for the full accomplishment of their said intentions this twenty-ninth Day of the Eighth Month in the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and ninety two they the said Samuel Hopkins and Hannah Janney appeared at a public Meeting of the said people at Fairfax Meeting-House aforesaid, and the said Samuel Hopkins taking the said Hannah Janney by the hand did in a solemn manner openly declare that he took her to be his wife; Promising with Divine Assistance to be unto her a loving and faithful Husband until Death should separate them (or words to the same purpose). And then & there in the same Assembly the said Hannah Janney did in like manner declare that she took him the said Samuel Hopkins to be her husband, Promising with Divine Assistance to be unto him a loving & faithful Wife until Death should separate them (or words to that effect).

And Moreover they the said Samuel Hopkins and Hannah Janney according to the custom of marriage assuming the name of her (Husband) as a farther confirmation thereof did then and there to their presents set their hands.

And we whose names are hereunto subscribed being present at the solemnization of their said Marriage and Subscription have as Witnesses thereunto set our hands the day & Year first above written.

the just whose end is peace and their memory precious

oh what ~~causes~~ <sup>is</sup> looking back! and in reflecting is it pos-  
sible to restrain the falling tear? no: for me tis not time and the  
remaining conflicts to be endured may in measure divert me  
from the scene, the awful event: but nothing will ever be able  
whilst I have my senses, to efface the remembrance of the Dear  
companion now lost to me.
